On 15 November, Liechtenstein took over from Latvia as Chairman of the Committee of Ministers for the next six months. Its priorities revolve around the motto "United by our values, towards a future that meets the needs of all".

Numerous cultural events will be organized between January and April 2024, in which the Amicale will be associated. The end of Liechtenstein's presidency will be marked by the celebration of the 75th anniversary of the Council of Europe, to which the Association will make its contribution.

As a tribute to "Pink October", the October selection hosted four talented female artists in the Palais and Agora:

<u>"Enfance"</u>, the ceramic miniatures of Manuella Martins (France) inspired by childhood were hosted in the showcases space of the Palais, while two remarkable painting exhibitions were in the main gallery:

<u>"Fole"</u>, by our member and friend Catherine de Solère (France), an exhibition inspired in particular by the themes of Time and Wind

and

<u>"Displaced"</u>, by Tatjana Balac (North Macedonia) which dealt with the motifs of the refugee and migrant crisis.

<u>"Part"</u>, a series of love-inspired acryl on canvas paintings by Svetlana Ninkovic (Serbia) was on display in the Agora.



These exhibitions were followed in November by new ones, currently on display.

"YGITHA" is a joint exhibition by a couple of artists inspired by a similar vision but using different mediums: you can admire the precious stones jewellery by <u>Arvydas</u> <u>Rancevas</u> (Lithuania) in the showcase space of the Palais until the end of December, while the expressive paintings inspired by mythology by <u>Jurgita Ranceviene</u> are sharing the gallery space of the Palais until the end of November with <u>"Travel, pictures"</u>, landscapes oil paintings by Stojan Milanov (Serbia).





We hope everyone has a great time!


LITERARY MEETING WITH SOFIA ANDRUKHOVYCH

On the 15 October, the Amicale sponsored a literary meeting with the Ukranian writer Sofia Andrukhovych at the BNU, where she discussed her new book.

How can a semblance of order and humanity be restored to a reality shattered by war?

In this poignant diary of the first year of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, Sofia Andrukhovych attempts to name and express that which has no name, that which lies far beyond human perception: that which is frightening to talk about, that which slips away. The author looks for links between fragments of reality torn apart by war and violence, and a desire to sketch out and observe the phenomena and reactions of human consciousness in the face of traumatic events. We are thus confronted with a multitude of encounters and characters from stories and experiences, incomprehensible combinations, drama and tragedy, comic or ridiculous manifestations, empathy and tenderness. In these seemingly inhuman circumstances, all that is human manifests itself more deeply and fully.


Sofia Andrukhovych will be in the selection of the 3rd edition of the Amicale's European prize for love novels (2024-2025) with her first novel "Felix Austria".

On the 16th of October, the Amicale and the Kléber bookshop were honored to welcome **Sorour Kasmai**, coordinator of the collective work "Woman, dream, freedom", and **Bahiyyih Nakhjavani**, one of the authors, to discuss the situation of women in Iran, the repression to which they are subjected, and their dreams of freedom.

The book is a transformative collection of stories that continue to shed light on the critical situation for women in Iran today, and looks at the reasons for the anger that engulfed the country since September 16, 2022, the day the young Mahsa Jina Amini succumbed to the beatings of the morality police.




THE AMICALE FILM CLUB

The International Amateur Athletics Federation (now World Athletics) ruled that certain female athletes must medically alter their healthy bodies in order to compete. Their naturally high androgen levels, deemed a performance advantage. "Category: Woman" focuses on four athletes. from the Global South forced out of competition by these regulations, the devastation to their bodies, and lives but equally arresting their passion for sport is further emboldened by their conviction to stand up for their human rights. Following up on her awardwinning film "Toxic Beauty", Phyllis Ellis exposes an industry controlled by men putting women's lives at risk while this policing of women's bodies in sport remains, in a more nefarious way, under the guise of fair play.

December in Palais de l'Europe – Projection Room – 12:15 to 2pm. The Canadian director and producer of the documentary Phyllis Ellis, will be present, alongside Payoshni Mitra, an activist for the rights of athletes.

The screening of the movie (in English only) will be followed by a short **Q&A** session moderated by Francine H. Raveney, the EPAS Deputy Executive Secretary (Enlarged Partial Agreement on Sport), in presence of Evgenia Giakoumopoulou, Head of the Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity (SOGI) at the Directorate General of Democracy and Human Dignity.





CONCERT FOR PEACE


